

TOP 8 QUESTIONS ANSWERED

1 - WHEN and WHERE do we REGISTER and PAY?

Registration will take place TONIGHT at the POOL SHELTER from 8:30 until 9:15. There will also be a LEADERS CRACKER BARRELL. If you are a SCOUT-MASTER or if you are TEACHING A MERIT BADGE, come by for a snack and pick up your information packet and MERIT BADGE COUNSELORS can pick up their SHIRT.

2 - Where's my T-Shirt?

T-Shirts will be distributed THURSDAY MORNING after the Flag Ceremony at the TRADING POST by TROOP - NO INDIVIDUAL SHIRTS WILL BE DISTRIBUTED.

3 - I lost my schedule, Now what?

Your SCOUTMASTER has a master list of all the Scouts in your Troop and their schedules. YOU should make a copy of YOUR SCHEDULE from this list and keep up with it. If you lose yours, see your SCOUTMASTER to make another copy.

4 - Is there ICE for my cooler?

Maybe. Check the ICE MAKER in the DINING HALL. Please be considerate and don't hog all the ice. Ice is available for sale at the gas station at the Interstate

5 - Where do I park?

This is a SCOUT CAMP, not a CAR CAMP. We ask that you DO NOT PARK IN YOUR CAMPSITE. Unload your gear, drop your trailer and move your vehicle to the parking area near the pond.

6 - What about DAY VISITORS?

Visitors who are not camping may park in the designated area near the pond. All visitors to Camp Roland must register.

7 - I lost my Scout Handbook. Where is Lost & Found?

If you find something around camp or if you lose something, please check with the LOST & FOUND Officer at the TRADING POST.

8 - What are the hours for the BATHROOMS and SHOWERS?

We are fortunate at Camp Roland to have separate facilities for youth and adults. No one 18 years or older should enter the BOYS or GIRLS bathroom (except for when announced for cleaning and maintenance). No one under 18 years old is allowed in the MENS or WOMENS restroom. Restrooms are open 24 hour each day. Showering should take place between 6:00 a.m. and 11:30 p.m.

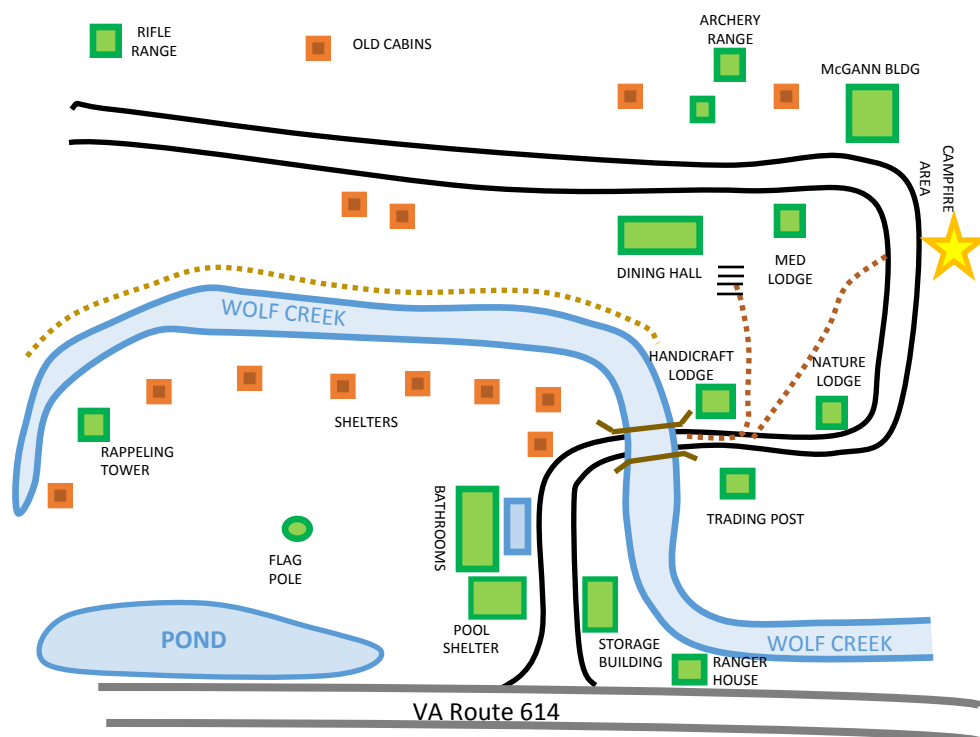
BSA RULES FOR CAMPING

- ◇ 2-Deep Leadership in effect at ALL TIMES.
- ◇ Scout Tents and Adult Tents separated - No adults in Scout tents, no Scouts in adult tents.
- ◇ No pets in Camp - No dogs, cats, zebras, giraffes or other critters are allowed.
- ◇ No bicycles, skateboards, scooters, go-carts, dune buggies, Humvees, tanks, jet packs or other such vehicles are allowed (except in the case of medical necessity).
- ◇ NO ONE may ride in the back of pickup trucks or in any area of any vehicle not designed for passenger occupancy.
- ◇ Vehicular traffic is prohibited in the camping area (near the Shelters) and across the bridge (exceptions include Rifle Range personnel, Archery Range personnel, Cooking personnel, and by medical necessity).
- ◇ Quiet hours are from 11:00 p.m. through 7:00 a.m. No noise should leave your campsite between these hours. Please be considerate of others.
